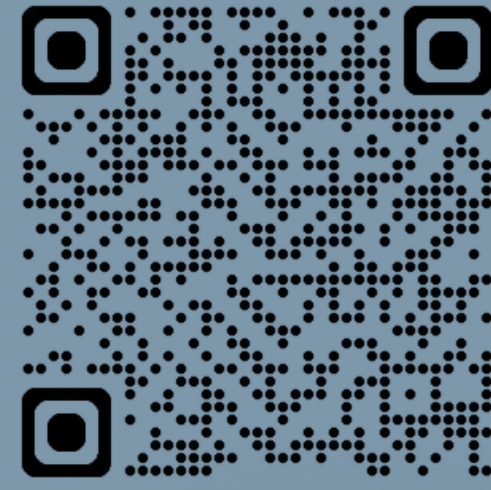

SENIOR SERVICES

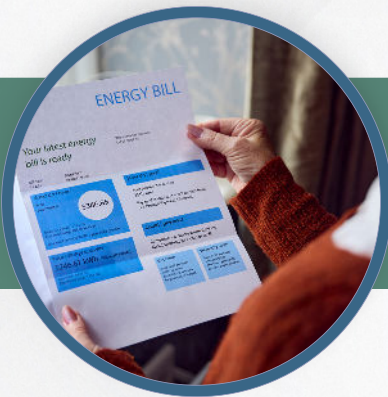
Empowers seniors to maintain their health and nutritional well-being and allows seniors to remain in their homes.

12,157

Hot, nutritious meals served to **123** seniors in a congregate setting

ENERGY ASSISTANCE

Heats homes during the winter season and extends budgets for low income households.

850

Households received assistance with their utility payments.

169

Households received additional crisis assistance.



WEATHERIZATION

Lowers energy bills for low-income people.

Households had their homes weatherized.

Households received home conservation services funded through the local utility companies.

43

Households received energy related repairs, such as furnace replacements.



HOUSING REHAB LOANS

Improves living conditions for low-income households and preserves quality, affordable housing.

OUTREACH AND EMERGENCY SERVICES

Supports people through a crisis and allows them to utilize their limited income until they reach stability.
