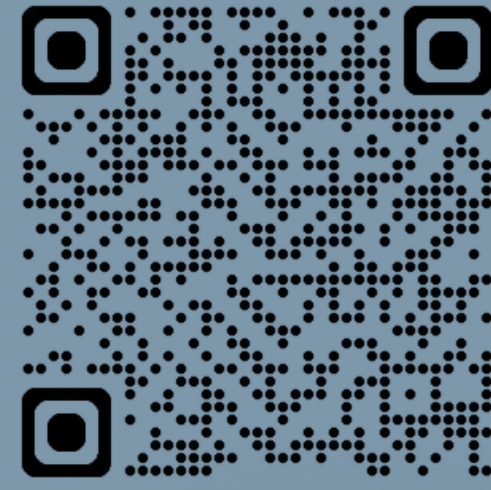




MOWER COUNTY

SENIOR SERVICES

Empowers seniors to maintain their health and nutritional well-being and allows seniors to remain in their homes.

12,943

Hot, nutritious meals served to **89** seniors in a congregate setting

13,789

Nutritious meals were delivered to **80** home-bound seniors.



ENERGY ASSISTANCE

Heats homes during the winter season and extends budgets for low income households.

921

Households received assistance with their utility payments.

187

Households received additional crisis energy assistance.



WEATHERIZATION

Lowers energy bills for low-income people.

16

Households had their homes weatherized.

Households received home conservation services funded through the local utility companies.

29

Households received energy related repairs, such as furnace replacements.



HEAD START & EARLY HEAD START

Empowers families & young children for school readiness and provides Head Start families with comprehensive services.

100

Children & families were educated at the Head Start classrooms.

Children (ages birth-3 years) received Early Head Start services at their homes.

Parents were supported during the early years of their child's life.



OUTREACH AND EMERGENCY SERVICES

Supports people through a crisis and allows them to utilize their limited income until they reach stability.

Households were assisted with deposit, rent or mortgage payments to prevent homelessness, impacting **135** individuals.
