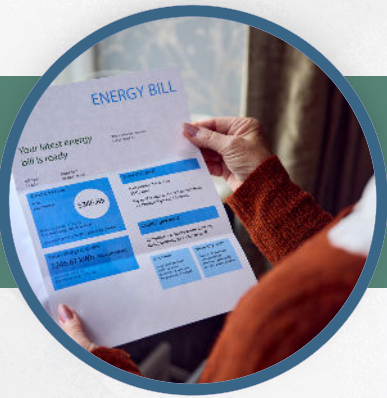
Hot, nutritious meals were served to **110** seniors in a congregate setting

ENERGY ASSISTANCE

Heats homes during the winter season and extends budgets for low income households.

WEATHERIZATION

Lowers energy bills for low-income people.

Improves living conditions for low-income households and preserves quality, affordable housing.
