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What is HIV?

HIV stands for Human Immunodeficiency Virus. It is a disease that weakens the body's immune system, so it cannot fight off illness or infection. It is transmitted through unprotected sexual contact or sharing of needles/sryinges. HIV can lead to AIDS, or Acquired Immodeficiency Syndrome.

Who is at Risk?

Certain individuals carry a higher risk of becoming infected with HIV including those who:

- have unprotected sex (anal, oral, or vaginal)
- -men who have sex with other men
- -someone who injects drugs
- -have been diagnosed with another STI, like chlamydia, gonorrhea, or syphilis

How to Get Tested.

The Semcac Clinic offers both traditional blood tests, which can take up to two weeks for results, and a rapid 60 second test that requires a finger prick. On June 27th, we are offering free HIV testing from 2-4 pm in observance of National HIV Testing Day.

How to Reduce Your Risk of Infection.

- Know you and your partners' status
- Use a condom every time you have sex
- -If you are at a higher risk, use PrEP (a medication that helps prevent infection)
- Get tested regularly and if you have multiple partners, ask them to get tested as well
- -Do not inject illicit drugs (those that are not prescribed by your doctor)
- -Do not share needles, syringes, or other equipment if you inject medications
