## Impact Report for Winona County | 2018

---

Information in this report is for the 2017 fiscal year; **Oct. 1, 2016 – Sept. 30, 2017**

### Semcac locations in Winona County

---

- Semcac Clinic and the Winona County Contact Office, is located at Semcac Center, 76 W. 3<sup>rd</sup> Street, Winona.
- Semcac Senior Dining sites are located at 4 different locations in Rollingstone, St. Charles, and 2 in Winona.
- 2 Semcac Head Start centers - one located in St. Charles and one in Winona.

### About Semcac

---



Semcac was established as a private, non-profit organization in 1966. Originally known as the Southeast Minnesota Citizens Action Council, Inc., the agency's legal name has been Semcac since 1995. Beginning in Winona, Fillmore and Houston counties, Semcac is now the designated Community Action Agency for seven counties—Dodge, Fillmore, Freeborn, Houston, Mower, Steele and Winona—and provides services in five additional counties—Goodhue, Olmsted, Rice, Wabasha and Waseca.

Semcac offers over 25 programs from 70 locations which include the main office in Rushford, a Semcac Center in Winona, 7 county offices (Contact Centers), 9 Head Start centers, Transportation Dispatch Center in Kasson and 44 Senior Dining sites and/or kitchens. We currently have a workforce of approximately 236 people.

Semcac has been connecting people with resources to ensure that they can achieve their goals of self-reliance and independence for 51 years. We are the voice for the voiceless and invest private, federal and public dollars back into the communities to strengthen our greatest resource- the people.



## **Impact in Winona County - Helping Greater Minnesota's Rural Communities**

---

Senior Nutrition results in seniors who are empowered to maintain their health and nutritional wellbeing and allows at-risk seniors to remain in their own home.

---

- 34,749 hot, nutritious meals were served in a congregate setting at Senior Dining to 637 seniors in Winona County.
- 13,524 nutritious meals were delivered by Meals on Wheels volunteers to 101 Winona County seniors in Lewiston, Minnesota City, Rollingstone, St. Charles, Stockton and Utica.

Energy Assistance results in keeping people warm by heating homes during the winter season, thus extending the limited, low household income.

---

- 1,186 households in Winona County received assistance with their utility payments during the winter season. And, 225 households received additional crisis assistance.

Weatherization results in greener communities, lower energy bills for low-income people and creates new jobs.

---

- 30 households in Winona County had their homes weatherized and learned more about energy conservation. 34 households received home conservation services funded through the local utility companies' Conservation Improvement Programs administered by Semcac.
- 20 households received energy related repairs, such as furnace replacement.

Family Planning – Semcac Clinic services result in an increased number of cervical cancer screenings, the prevention & treatment of STI's, a reduced number of unplanned pregnancies, an increase in comprehensive education about sexual health.

---

- 937 patients residing in Winona County visited Semcac Clinic in Winona.
- Last year, the Clinic's Education & Outreach Specialist presented comprehensive, reproductive and sexual health education information at several events in the area, reaching 2,416 people.

Outreach and Emergency Services supports people through a crisis and allows them to more effectively utilize their limited income until they reach stability.

---

- 99 individuals from 43 households in Winona County attended budgeting or financial literacy education/counseling.
- 46 individuals received crisis financial assistance for transportation, a medical issue or another immediate basic need in Winona County.
- 21 households were assisted with payments such as rent or mortgage, to prevent homelessness in Winona County.
- Staff provided information & referrals (to other/outside organizations) to 1,689 individuals from 650 households in Winona County. Additionally, our staff provided information & referrals within the agency/Semcac to 2,183 households.

Head Start results in empowered families and young children who are ready for kindergarten. Head Start families receive comprehensive services from Semcac.

---

- 183 children and their families (in 70 households) were educated at the Head Start Centers, or with home-based educators, in Winona County during the program year.
- 45 children (age birth – 3 years) and/or pregnant women received Early Head Start services, at their home, in Winona County.

Semcac Transportation results in people getting to their medical and dental appointments, senior dining and other locations to meet essential needs; assisting people with no other means of transportation.

---

- 9,133 rides were provided on Rolling Hills Transit buses in Winona County.
- 7,458 rides were provided through the Volunteer Driver Program in Winona County to 523 people.

Housing Rehab Loans result in improved living condition for low-income people and the preservation of quality affordable housing.

---

- 2 homes in Winona County was assisted with rehabilitation through the Minnesota Housing Owner Rehab Loan program, administered by Semcac.
- 1 home in Winona County was assisted via the Fix-Up Fund program.

### Semcac Overall - FY2017 Statistics

---

- Semcac served 21,016 unduplicated individuals in addition to providing 58,354 rides via public transit, Rolling Hills Transit bussing.
- Semcac has 1,176 partnerships with 965 organizations, as of fiscal year 2017.
- Semcac serves 7 southeastern MN counties and provides limited services in 5 additional counties.

### Volunteers Make a Difference

---

Every year, volunteers from all of the counties we serve, join Semcac to help people. Their sacrifices bridge the generational gaps and inspire others. Last year **1,637** volunteers contributed **78,404** hours to the programs and people we serve. Thank you to all of our passionate volunteers!
